2021 offered me time for reflection - long periods of enforced lockdowns and no opportunity for travel. Time to mostly stay close to home and connect with the natural landscape on my doorstep. I made each daily lockdown walk really count, with all my senses alert to the world around me. Drawing outside became a wonderful routine which I looked forward to each day. It is a privilege to stop and notice tiny daily changes as the seasons slowly revolve.




I made no advance plans, but merely drew the things that caught my attention, as I walked or sat in the landscape.


Ordinary things become extraordinary as soon as you pay attention to them. I have a determination to stay curious and allow new insights to emerge in my drawings.

Seeing should be an active process- that might mean noticing a new bud emerging; glimpses of unexpected colour; interesting shapes and patterns; shifting light and shadows; how weather and time affect the natural world or simply watching rocks merge into ocean as the tide ebbs and flows. Truly nothing in the landscape remains static.












L to R: Come With Me You Are Here Standing Steady

Coastal studies

My sketchbook accompanied me on all these mindful walks. Drawing is visual thinking, and a wonderfully effective tool to achieve a powerful engagement with the natural world. The observing and thinking is a slow process, although my sketchbook drawings are mostly fast and loose. I add random marks with paint or collage to the sketchbook pages before I set out, to give my imagination something to work with. I welcome imperfection in these drawings and merely look for the beauty and joy of being in the moment. However it is extraordinary that making a simple drawing can fuse the memories of each place into my head in such a powerful way.








